

Kent Community Garden Guidelines for Use of the Garden

- The Garden is open from dawn to dusk, May through October this year. With prior permission, gardeners may overwinter crops outside of the open season.
- o Be respectful of all gardeners and garden visitors.
- O No dogs are allowed in the Garden.
- O No alcohol is allowed in the Garden.
- We follow a "Carry In, Carry Out" Policy with respect to trash. Please do not dispose
 of additional trash in the Garden. Compostable waste may be disposed of in
 designated areas.
- O Children are welcome but must be supervised at all times. Please keep children from picking produce or flowers from other gardeners' plots or common areas.
- Use of pesticide or herbicide treatments is strictly forbidden. Organic fertilizers are permitted.
- Individual plot gardeners must maintain their garden plots, keeping them tidy and with weeds at a minimum. Roots, shoots and vines must stay within the bounds of the plot.
- o Produce and flowers grown in individual plots must not be sold.
- O All plots must be cleared at season end.
- o Subscribers must notify the Kent Land Trust of their intent to abandon their plot.
- O Please stay off of Kent Center School property when school is in session.

All plots measure 4' x 10' accommodating a wide variety of veggies (or smorgasbord of just a few kinds). Gardeners subscribing to adjacent plots may combine these plots into larger beds.
Members and plot subscribers need not be residents of Kent. However, the Kent Land Trust reserves the right to limit plot subscription to Kent residents depending upon demand. The garden will open for planting in May.

Please enclose fee\$30 for a plot, \$15 for each additional plot. Most people get double plots (10'x10') for \$45. Checks may be made to: Kent Land Trust - Kent Community Garden
